The Regular monthly meeting of Shamokin City Council was held this evening with Councilman Garth Hall presiding.

CALL TO ORDER: Councilman Hall called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM

Councilman Hall called an Executive Meeting at 7:33 PM City Clerk notes that the session was to discuss legal and personnel matters. The meeting reconvened at 7:42 PM.

VISITORS: Richard Post, of 625 BVA, stated that the coal trucks are driving by with fly ash, which contains various heavy metals that can cause lung damage and other adverse health effects. He has brought a petition before council to propose legislation to curtail the unsafe driving of the coal trucks and the waste they haul.

Jim McGee, of 742 Race St., stated he opposes the boarding houses near St. Stan's Convict.

Daniel Phelps, of 1005 N. Vine St., explained his concern about a property next to his on Bunker Hill. He stated that 1007 N. Vine St., owned by John Pickens, is unsafe and has hazardous materials stored there and is a fire hazard. Mr. Phelps stated he is on disability and that he helped repair Mr. Pickens' roof and wasn't paid. Mr. Phelps would like the city to do something about the situation.

Allen Straub, of 518 BVA, stated that when it rains it causes the coal trucks to produce a black liquid that runs off the trucks leaving behind unsafe chemicals. He stated that these trucks have mesh screens, which do little to curtail this. He wants to know when this will end.

Chris Post, of 625 BVA, explained that radar signs that utilize solar power can be acquired and used to help slow down the unsafe speed in which many of the coal trucks are driving at. He stated that the truck tarps aren't water proofed and should be better wrapped. He would like the city to enforce this.

Timothy Vincent, of 655 BVA, agreed about the unsafe truck speed and school busses. He said there was no confirmed date on the clean-up project on Pearl St. He stated he would like to schedule a meeting with the Council. Councilman Hall stated it could be held at the next workshop on May 7.

Jeremy Bulchie, of 625 BVA, stated that information isn't available to the public in regards to the chemicals being hauled away by the coal trucks. He stated he would like this information to be made public. He also explained that the speeding of the trucks is problematic and that two (2) accidents have recently occurred. He would like to see a greater police presence.
