



History of the City





The name SHAMOKIN is a word in the language of the Delaware Indians which signifies "Eel Creek". Five nations of Indians occupied the Shamokin Indian Village at the confluence of the two branches of the Susquehanna River in what would later become Sunbury.

The town of Shamokin was laid out at this current location on March 1, 1835. The town was formed in the true tradition of a Melting Pot. Places of worship sprouted to serve the masses: Roman Catholic, Methodist, Presbyterian, Baptist, Lutheran, and Jewish, among others. The city grew beyond mining to include

bakeries, ice cream and dairy factories, F&S Brewery, Eagle Silk Mill, dress, shoe and hosiery factories, as well was three movie theaters. The Borough of Shamokin was incorporated in 1864. In January 1950, the Borough became a Third Class City.


Coal, or "Black Diamonds", was first discovered in what would later become Kulpmont around 1790 when Isaac Tomlinson picked some pieces out of Quaker Run and took them into Berks County for a Blacksmith to try. Around 1875, Mr. Tomlinson erected a blacksmith shop and used Shamokin Stone Coal. From this small beginning emerged an industrial giant, "coal", which was to play a big part of the Industrial Revolution, and played an even more revolutionary role in the development of the city.

At its peak in the 1920's, the combined population of Shamokin and Coal Township was 50,000 with primary industries in coal mining and silk from the J.H. & C.K. Eagle Silk Mills. The loss of much of the coal industry as the nation turned to oil as its primary source of energy, loss of the silk industry in favor of synthetic textiles that could be manufactured cheaper overseas, the great depression which began in 1929 and the loss of Shamokin's two railroads resulted in a decrease in the current total population of Shamokin and Coal Township to a little over 18,000. Still, after an 80 year period of decline, the community is turning a corner to recovery.

The most famous name associated with Shamokin is Thomas Alva Edison. Shamokin capitalists were among the first to recognize the significance of Edison's carbon filament lamp. They supplied all the money necessary to erect a power station in Shamokin and placed it under Edison's immediate supervision. Edison was only 35 years old when he arrived in Shamokin in the early fall of 1882. In November of that year, the Edison Electrical Illuminating Company of Shamokin was incorporated. Shamokin was the site of the second three-wire electric light station in the world in 1883 (Sunbury, Pennsylvania, was the first). Edison's plant, for those of you visiting Shamokin, is now the site of the future hotel at 117 E Independence Street. St. Edward's Church (built in 1873, now Mother Cabrini Roman Catholic Church) became the first church in the America to be lit by electricity.

Many people resided in the community while traveling great distances to maintain personal employment to support their families. The community is proud of its friendly citizens and willingness for neighbors to help each other through difficult times.

Demographics

Racial Makeup

Per a 2019 estimate from the Census Bureau, the racial makeup of Shamokin was 92.7% White, 1% African American, 8.5% Hispanic/Latino, and 4.6% from two or more races.

Per a 2019 estimate from the Census Bureau, the racial make up of Coal Township was 81.8% White, 13.7% African, 6.6% Hispanic/Latino, and 2% from two or more races.

Population and Housing

Per a 2019 estimate from the Census Bureau, the population of Shamokin was 6,952 and the population of Coal Township was 10,208.

From the 2000 census, there were 3,742 households, out of which:

- o 24.0% had children under the age of 18
- o 36.4% were married couples living together
- o 45.8% were non-families

Of all households, 41.2% were made up of individuals, and 22.6% had someone living alone who was 65 years of age or older

Economy and Income



Ordinance Highlights



Street Sweeper

A regularly scheduled street sweeper runs from April through November. The schedule is listed on the City website. Fines will be issued for non-compliance.

Garbage Collection

It is the responsibility of the homeowner/tenant to confirm garbage collection and/or contact a garbage hauler. There is no municipal garbage collection .

Recycling

Shamokin City has a Curbside Recycling Collection process. The schedule is as follows:

Items must be placed at curbside by 7:00 AM on the respective dates listed below

- **Zone 1 -** Collected on the first Thursday of each month

 West side of Market Street West to First Street Adams Street North to Sunbury Street.
- **Zone 2 -** Collected on the second Thursday of each month

 Independence Street North to the city line Market Street East to Dubarry Street.
- **Zone 3 -** Collected on the third Thursday of each month

 East side of Market Street East to Gold Street Lincoln Street South to the city line.
- **Zone 4** Collected on the fourth Thursday of each month

 Washington Street East to the city line Independence Street South to the city line.

Recycling on the scheduled dates can be affected by inclement weather such as snow during the winter months.

Items that **CAN** be recycled include: aluminum cans, bimetal (tin) cans, glass bottles and jars - clear brown - green - colored.


When recycling the above listed items, the following rules should be followed:

- Wash and clean cans, bottles, and jars.
- Remove all lids, caps, and labels from items.
- Do not mix recyclable items together. Separate items into container of like items.
- Place at curbside on your respective pickup date by 7:00 AM.

The following rules will apply to the recycling of plastic bottles and jars:

- Only items identified with the recycling symbol will be accepted.
- Remove all lids and caps from items.
- Crush or flatten items if possible to decrease volume.

AOAA



The Northumberland County Anthracite Outdoor Adventure Area (AOAA) is a 6,500 acre motorized and non-motorized recreation facility with its welcome center and parking lot located at 4100 State Route 125, Coal Township, PA 17866-7806. Phone number for the Welcome Center is 570-648-2626. The AOAA is NOW OPEN for motorized vehicles of all types (ATVs, UTVs, SxS, Dirt Bikes, and

Full Size Vehicles). The 3,000 acre Eastern Reserve is available for open riding, with mapped and signed intersections. The 3,500 acre Western Reserve is open on weekends only.

Knoebels



America's largest free-admission amusement park also offers free parking, free daily entertainment and free picnic facilities. Take a dip in the 900,000-gallon Crystal Pool filled with refreshing mountain stream water. The pool area includes waterslides, diving boards and a play area just for young children. Stay overnight at one of two campgrounds that include cabins and over 800 campsites. In addition to over 60 rides, award-winning food, swimming, games,

miniature golf and gift shops, visitors can add a round of golf at Knoebels Three Ponds Golf Course right next door to the park.

Pioneer Coal Mine Tour




Pioneer Tunnel is a tourist attraction located in Ashland, PA. The tourist attraction has a coal mine tour, steam train ride, a gift shop, and food shop. The Coal Mine Tour is described as a horizontal drift mine. Its level tunnel runs 1800 feet straight into the side of the Mahanoy Mountain. You make the trip in comfort, riding in open mine cars pulled by a battery-operated mine motor. The steam train ride allows you to travel back through time on an old-time narrow

gauge steam locomotive, the Henry Clay. Built in the 1920's, The Henry Clay takes you on a scenic three-quarter mile ride around the side of Mahanoy Mountain to show you another kind of mining called strip mining. You'll visit the Mammoth Stripping, an area where an unusually thick seam of anthracite known as the Mammoth Vein outcrops to the surface of the earth.
