DIRECTORS' REPORTS:

Accounts & Finance

Councilwoman Moyer reported a balance in the General Fund of \$1,007,210.67. The full breakdown has not been completed but will be available by the next city council meeting.

Parks and Public Buildings

Councilman Duganitz commented on the success of the Independence on Independence event and thanked Justin Bainbridge for his help. A few vendors left early due to the high temperatures, but many returned in the evening and signed up for next year. Councilman Duganitz also thanked Chief Siko and the police department for their presence during the event, as well as the fireworks committee for the success of the fireworks display.

Councilman Duganitz mentioned that swim lessons start today, July 8, 2024 at 6:00 P.M. at the Strausser-Shroyer Memorial Pool, and thanked Betsy Kramer of SEDA-COG for her work on the grant that made this program free. Anyone interested will need to sign up to join the lessons, which will run through the end of the week. Councilman Duganitz added that the parks department is researching possible private grant funding options for improvements to the Race Street and Shamokin Street playgrounds.

Streets and Public Improvements

The Director of Public Works was absent from the meeting.

Public Safety

The Fire Department reported 44 calls for the month of June.

The Code Enforcement Office collected \$4,306 in revenue for the month of June.

Councilman Kehler reported that Engine 11 had a broken stem repaired but still needs additional repairs, as does Engine 33. Repairs for Engine 51 are going through insurance. Barricades were recently put up around unsafe properties on North 4th Street and on the corner of Shamokin and Spurzheim Streets.

Chief of Police

The Police Department reported 2,067 calls for the month of June.

Chief Siko reported that the police department is working with Betsy Kramer to determine whether the City may be eligible to have a co-responder from Mental Health assigned to the police station. The cost

to fund the hiring would be \$125,000 per year; however, there are multiple grant opportunities available. If hired, the co-responder would relieve the burden on the police department by assisting with crisis response, overdose and domestic violence situations, as well as providing administrative support with programs such as Women In Transition. Chief Siko stated that he believes there is a great need for these services in our area and that he and Betsy will be meeting in the near future to determine the City's eligibility.

Councilman Duganitz asked for an update on the National Night Out event. Chief Siko replied that the event is scheduled for August 6th at Claude Kehler Park and that he continues to be in communication with the committee and Crime Watcher. The new canine may make her debut at this event.

SEDA-COG

Betsy Kramer spoke on the subject of the DEP "MORE" grant, which is being pursued through a collaborative effort between Kramer of SEDA-COG, Matt McMullen of Americorps Vista, and Downtown Manager Justin Bainbridge. The grant would provide \$50,000 toward a Level 2 Energy Audit and energy efficiency retrofitting of municipal buildings, such as the American Legion and City Hall. Approval to apply for this grant is up for vote in tonight's council meeting. Ms. Kramer added that part of the grant may be used as an interest buy-down in the event the City obtains a loan to fund implementation of the plan. However, she stressed that she is focused on securing grant funds rather than a loan.

Ms. Kramer also stated that the planning phase for the Independence Street Downtown Makeover project is well underway, as is the Safe Streets for All project. Proposals for the Volunteer Park and Footbridge Feasibility Study are currently being accepted and are due by August 9th. Interested parties should direct bids to City Hall to the attention of Justin Bainbridge. Ms. Kramer added that grant funds for various projects are approved but delayed until the State passes a budget.

Downtown Manager Bainbridge spoke on the success of "Independence on Independence" and thanked the police and street department for going above and beyond in their assistance with the event.

Councilman Duganitz asked whether this ordinance covers the ATV chained to a pole. The Solicitor replied that it does as "vehicles" are broadly defined.

The Solicitor provided an update on the tax exempt property challenges. Originally, fifteen parcels had been identified for review, and that list has now been narrowed down to five. The City will review these parcels to determine whether they still qualify as tax exempt. This is not an automatic process; there will be a hearing to determine tax exempt eligibility.

CITIZENS' COMMENTS:

Robert Boyce spoke on the subject of the new ordinances and asked Council to elaborate on the criteria used to determine whether a vehicle is hazardous. The Solicitor replied that police are responsible for determining a vehicle's condition. Chief Siko added that the police follow Pennsylvania law as well as City ordinances in making their judgment. Mr. Boyce asked what recourse citizens have if they wish to dispute a determination. Chief Siko replied that if anyone is cited for an abandoned vehicle, they may request a hearing before a court judge. Mr. Boyce also asked for a clarification as to whether the second line item of the ordinance applies to any private property in the City of Shamokin. The Solicitor confirmed that it does. Mr. Boyce closed his remarks by stating that he believes the exact criteria for defining an abandoned vehicle should be well-publicized to ensure the public is properly informed.

Dakota Schuck took the podium to comment on the great fireworks show in the City.
